Babies

The Babies have been experiencing lots of new activities. We have been exploring the paint with our hands to feel the texture of the paint and to see the marks we can make. We have been out in the garden planting bulbs and listening to different sounds such as the leaves crunching as we playing with them. The older Babies have been showing their experiences through play putting the dolls to bed and taking them for a walk.



Toddlers

Toddlers have been setting up provocations around Nursery rhymes. We have been singing “Humpty Dumpty”, “Incy Wincy” and “Twinkle Twinkle”. We built a wall for Humpty Dumpty and the Toddlers enjoyed knocking him off his wall, we learnt about Incy Wincy and how many legs he has and then made our very own playdough spiders! We are now exploring stars investigating lights and making star shadows on the walls!



Transition

This month we have been exploring Autumn. The children have been out and about in the woods collecting different natural resources to bring back to Nursery and use to create different pieces of art work. We have made Autumn leaf paintings and have been very busy out in our garden collecting the acorns for Jack's pigs! We have also been looking into the different colours that Autumn bring us, which has led us onto colour sorting.



Kindergarten

This month the children took an interest in the ‘Stickman’ book. We read the story before discussing their favourite parts. From this the children then made their own illustrations, looking at the book and showcasing all the lovely drawings in our book corner. We continued to explore this by taking a trip to the woods to collect sticks to make our very own stickman back at Nursery. Whilst we were there we collected leaves too which we have now been investigating as an Autumn provocation leaf rubbing, collaging and identifying the different colours of the leaves whilst we discuss the seasonal change.
